Insulated Walls

The cork insulation for the walls will be one and one half inches thick. This heavy insulation, particularly heavy in the roof, is designed to keep the house warm in cold weather. Experiments, according to Mr. Scripps have proved that the heat escapes through the roof. But as cork is a non-conductor, keeping the heat in and the cold out, the rooms in this home will be heated with a minimum of fuel for their cubic contents.

Two oil burners will furnish steam for the heating and to avoid having a storage tank in close proximity to the home a 15,000 gallon tank has been installed at the railway siding. An automatic pump will feed the boilers direct from this.

Huge Logs Imported

The half-timber work is all of English oak. The huge logs were imported in the rough, and were adze-hewn to dimension by the city's carpenter of the old school who was found on the water-front in Detroit. In years gone by this old salt fashioned many a mast and bow sprit.

Construction at present has reached the point where the steel girders to support the roof are being swung into place. The combined weight of the steel for this purpose is approximately 200 tons, and enormous though this quantity seems it is necessary to support the roof, the body of which will be propped about four inches thick insulated beneath with two inches of cork, and above with three layers of heavy felt. M.S.C. MENTOR TALKS TO VILLAGE ATHLETES

Young Praisers Sportsmanship of Birmingham Football Players in Game

Members of the Birmingham High School football team, Coach Ralph Young, head football coach of Michigan State College, and members of the Young Men's Service club dined at the Chateau Tea Room last week in honor of the successful season played by the high school football team this past fall. The meeting was arranged with Coach Young at the evening's speaker.

Compounding the team upon the victory gained during the year, the M. S. C. coach emphasized the importance of the clean and sportsmanlike playing that has featured each game and the persistent spirit of hard playing and willing team work. "An alert mind, a buoyant spirit, and a fleet body constitute to a great degree, the essential of a successful football player," stated the coach.

"Victory" means nothing if the game is not on the square and the work that the Birmingham squad has done in the past season points out that the playing of the game was the earnest endeavor of the team rather than the winning of a game. In latter life the ability to play fair will mean much, declared the coach.

Much credit for the team's success was extended to George Johnson who is coaching the team for his first year. A. L. Winkler, director of athletics, received flattering remarks for his share in steering the importance of fair play in the athletic development of the students. Both of the men rose to the occasion and accepted the encouraging acknowledgment of their efforts.

J. W. Parry, member of the school board, held the lastman's chair. Clarence Vliet, superintendent of schools, and Marvin C. Hart, principal of the high school, also spoke to the members of the team with open praise for the successful schedule. I. Phil Henry, the new captain, accepted the eulogies.

The entire team was represented with the exception of the retiring captain, Brown, who was ill. The attendance at the last game of the season, held Thanksgiving Day, breaks all records of the past for crowds and financial success.
