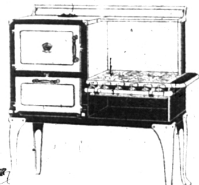

DEBT GOES UNPAID, BUT MEMORIAL IS ERECTED TO MEMORY OF GEN. MEADE

BEING given a memorial in marble and bronze on the Mall is one thing, it seems being paid an ancient claim validly due is quite another.

This ironical story of the family of General George C. Meade, the hero of Gettysburg, has just been brought back into the light by a bill introduced in Congress by Representative William R. Ware of Philadelphia. The bill would appropriate \$375,879.75 to settle a claim of the Meade family which has been pending more than a century.

While this old debt has gone unpaid, an elaborate statutory group in the memory of the Civil War general has been erected and is nearly ready for unveiling. The federal

children of the original claimant, who was General Meade's father, "The claim arose from the Na poleonic wars in Spain," says Con gressman Ware, who is seeking settlement.

"A settlement was adjudicated in the Spanish courts, giving Meade \$30,000 for a life annuity and a total for all claims of \$373,879.75."

All the other valid claims were settled. Technicians kept the Meade claim pending. It was not until more than a century later because of the exceptional services of the family to the nation. The original claimant's father was a Revolutionary patriot. General Meade had a brother who was a com modore in the navy, and the latter's

son was an admiral.

The executor of the estate now is a great-nephew of the general, Richard W. Meade of St. Louis. The Meade estate, according to Attorney Chancery Hackett, is the oldest un settled claim in the probate court of the District of Columbia.

There are about forty names who would share in the settlement if it were made. The claims do not draw interest, but would be enough in the first place to place them all in the heavy plutocratic class. Most of them are great grand

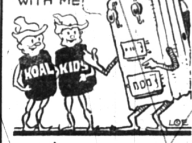
