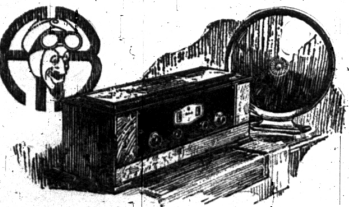

(Continued From Page 1) State Public Utilities Commission in the Ingham County court at Lansing and that it would not doubt be appealed to the State Supreme Court.

The Utilities Commission in a reply said it believed that the seven municipalities had no power to fix rates through their towns. These legal proceedings were said to be the first ever attempted to determine the powers of the Commission.
