Frigidaire Plans \$20,000,000 Plant

While a great number of American businesses have made announcements of extensive expansions during the past year, one of the most noteworthy of these harbingers of our country's prosperity comes with the news of a tremendous enlargement planned by the Delco Light Company in the Frigidaire plant at Moraine.

This concern, of General Motors direction, has enjoyed an astounding increase in business since 1924. Delco Light Plant sales for May were 20 percent greater than sales of the same period one year ago, records reveal. Lighting plant shipments for the first five months of 1926 show an increase of 53 percent over exports of a similar period in 1925. May Frigidaire sales were the highest in the history of the company.

During 1925, Frigidaire sales were 200 percent in excess of those of any previous year. Company officials are confident that the 1926 sales will triple any previous figure including the 1925 sales and they are planning production, shipping and distribution facilities accordingly.

The proposed building program provides only for the estimated needs of 1927. Five million dollars will be spent on the buildings alone. Seven millions are to be expended on machinery and to these two items are to be added eight millions of dollars for raw materials, inventories and accounts which must be available for the 5000 additional men to be employed. The new plant will have a production capacity of 600,000 Frigidaire electric refrigeration units per year.

On June 18th, ground was broken at the Moraine City site for the twenty million dollar expansion. It will mean greater production for all Delco Light products, as a part of the plant is to be devoted to the manufacture of other products than Frigidaire. Actual floor space acreage is to be more than doubled. From the present thirty-two acres the space, after the completion of the work will be sixty-eight acres. The addition is to be 210 feet wide and 1600 feet long, making the total length of the plant approximately one mile long.

This twenty million dollar expansion program that has been placed in effect by the Delco Light Company, already the world's largest builder of electric refrigerators and farm electric plants, is interpreted as the beginning of the one hundred million dollar expansion which the General Motors will put through, if necessary, to supply the world with dependable Delco Light products.

HUPP IS VICTOR IN ROUMANIAN RACE

Early reports of the Roumanian Grand Prix touring competition indicate a signal victory for American cars. In the touring contest sponsored by the Royal Auto Club of Roumania, a standard Hupmobile Six was victorious while a standard Hupmobile straight Eight finished first in the Hungarian touring competition according to a cable just received from Europe by Mr. E. B. Sides, Export Manager of the Hupmobile Car Corporation.

"The fact that both these races were run amid the most unfavorable weather conditions and over a course which included every sort of hazard makes these victories the more outstanding," says Mr. Sides in commenting on the race. Hupmobile has met with repeated success in European competition the same as in other parts of the world. In South Africa Hupmobile holds many cross country records over the most difficult routes imaginable.

"This latest victory in the Roumanian Grand Prix is more noteworthy because of the high class of cars entered. The best of European and American automobiles operated by expert drivers were entered in this competition which attracted great interest this year because of the anticipated rivalry manifested by car makers and drivers."

"As is generally known the Straight Eight is a popular engine type in Europe, and is used in their finest cars so that Hupmobile's victory is not surprising. And the success of the new Hupmobile Six in this field, proves it to be a worthy companion of the Eight.
