Bond Issue \$200,000

It has already purchased 4 lots on land contracts where the City Hall stands. It expects to use 4 more lots as a site-for the Fire Hall. The balance of the two blocks it wishes to purchase now for future municipal uses, a park, a postoffice building site or whatever seems best so that a solid nunicipal civic center, library and school area would extend from Pierce Street to Southfield Avenue.
- 2. If the Village Commission buys all this property on land contracts, the initial cost will be \$50,000 more and the interest charges 2% higher than purchase by a bond issue, or a total of \$100,000. Let's save this \$100,000 or 50% of the bond issue cost.
- The figures below show that Birmingham has a very low bonded indebtedness and can
  afford to vote the above issues which are real necessities.

Inasmuch as Eco City, Birmingham Estates, Coryell Park and numerous other recent territorial annexations are not included in the 1927 valuation, it is safe to say that the 1927 valuation will be \$20,000,000. By statutory law the bonded indebtedness of a village is limited to 10% of its valuation. If the \$415,000 of bonds proposed for la Village Library, Village Fire Hall and Civic Center carry, the total bonded debt would amount to \$802,000, or 6% of the present 1926 valuation and 4% of the prospective 1927 valuation, a net increase of but 1%, and far be low the 10% limit imposed by law.
