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The Effect on Your Taxes OF THE Proposed Bond Issues FOR THE Village Library, Village Fire Hall and Sites for Municipal Buildings TO BE VOTED ON Thursday, July 29, 1926 The Proposed Bond Issues for the Village Library of \$175,000, Village Fire Hall \$40,000 and Sites for Municipal Buildings, \$200,000, or a Total of \$415,000 will call for \$18,675 for Interest and \$10,000 for Serial Bonds Retired, or a total of \$28,675 for 1927. The assessed valuation of Birmingham in 1926 was \$12,600,000 and the rate of \$12.00 per thousand produced \$151,200 for the budget. Out of this budget \$14,182 was paid for serial bonds, \$7,300 for long term bonds and \$15,537 was paid for interest or a total of \$37,019 for bonds and interest which was 24.5% of the total budget. The assessed valuation of Birmingham for 1927 when Eco City, Birmingham Estates, Coryell Park and numerous other recent territorial annexations are included will be at least \$20,000,000. A tax rate of \$12.00 would produce a budget of \$240,000. Old bonds and interest will require \$39,020 and new bonds and interest \$28,675 or a total of \$67,695, which would be 28.2% of the 1927 budget or an increase of 3.7% over the budget of this year. While an increase of 50c per thousand on the assumed assessed valuation would care for the 3.7% increase, it is more than probable that no increase in the rate will be necessary and a YES vote on the proposed Bond Issues for the Village Library, the Village Fire Hall and Sites for Municipal Buildings will not increase your taxes for 1927
