Nearly 26 Miles Per Gallon With "Chevy"

With a gasoline average of 25.71 per gallon, L. H. Lawrence, of the "Chevy" of Los Angeles, driving his own Chevrolet, was an easy winner in the light car class at the first annual Chevrolet Conservation Contest held recently in California.

Entries were restricted to amateur drivers, and the Chevrolet of L. H. Lawrence's gasoline average was the best turned in by any of the 13 drivers participating in the contest which promises to become one of the classics of the western motor car.

Starting from the Automobile Club headquarters in Los Angeles, the run ended 20 miles away over Lake Arrowhead, a mile above mountain lakes in the San Bernardino mountains.

Lawrence's Chevrolet covered the distance on exactly 3.5 gallons of gasoline. No less remarkable was the car's demonstration of cooling ability. The day was the hottest of the present season and the climb over the steep Waterman Canyon switchbacks was made under a noon sun.

Despite these facts, however, the finish revealed that the radiator had never used four pints of water, a record unsurpassed by any other water-cooled car in the run. Lawrence bought his Chevrolet almost a year ago in preparation for the conservation contest he had the valves ground and, after thoroughly checking the car, he made a four-mile test run in the course of his daily driving.

9,000,000 Cars On Tour, A. A. Finds

Washington, D. C.—A preliminary survey of this year's tide of motor tourist travel by the National Touring Board of the American Automobile Association shows that nearly 9,000,000 automobiles carrying approximately 36,000,000 people will be on the roads during the long-distance tour this season.

"Of this total of 9,000,000 cars," declares the A. A. A. "9,000,000 will carry camping equipment and extend their outing to 33 days. Two-thirds of the caravan have not yielded to the canvas lure and will depend on hotels for accommodations. It will spend an average of 10 days on tour."

While it is impossible to determine exactly how much money the motor tourist will spend this season, the Board asserts that \$3,000,000,000 is a conservative estimate. This is nearly half a billion dollars more than was spent during the 1925 touring season.

It is also estimated that 2,000,000 cars will be sold during the 1926 season, including an attorney's office and also any value or value that shall be paid at or before said sale for taxes and fees.
