## Hupp 'Eight' Makes New Road Record

Flashing from the Olympic Hotel, Seattle, to the Manley Auto Co. Portland, 205 miles, in four hours and eight minutes, a Huppobile Eight driven by W. Hilligoss, recently set a new road record between the two cities. Deducting a six-minute stop at Chablis, Wash., for gasoline and oil, the car's running time averaged 50.83 miles an hour—a grueling test for both machine and driver.

In the car when it made the record run were five Seattle residents—Mr. Hilligoss, wholesale manager of the Sunset Motor Co., Humble oil distributors of that city; W. P. Ellwell, president of Hedlund & Co.; W. B. McGurdy, manager of the President Hotel; Allan Thompson, secretary of the Young Men's Business Club, and Ralph W. Barron.

The record is unusual in that it was made through day traffic, the party being checked out from the Olympic Hotel at 7:04 a. m. and checked in at the Manley Auto Co. at 11:12 a. m. Detours on the main Highline Route forced them to follow the longer Valley Route, adding 11 miles to their journey.

Mr. Ellwell, commenting in the run, said: "The opportunity of making a rather long trip in one of your cars was an occasion for surprise in several instances. First, the high speed possible with very little or no vibration; second, the smooth riding with no swaying or skidding at fast speed around corners; third, the economy in gas and oil; and fourth, the easy handling of the car. ## World's Only Five Ring Circus Coming
