VILLAGE ASKS THAT WATER USE BE CURBED

Shortage May Occur Unless Needless Sprinkling Is Stopped, Says Manager Starz.

Until the new Birmingham well in the southwest portion of the village is put into active operation, constant sprinkling of lawns and gardens may result in a water shortage in Birmingham, village manager Starz said today.

Water consumers, the village has prepared a letter for publication which is presented herewith: It has become necessary for the Village Commission to call attention to the provisions of the Water Ordinance No. 112 concerning the use of hose for sprinkling purposes. This ordinance allows sprinkling for four hours only each day, from June 1st to Oct. 1st.
