**14 PATIENTS EXAMINED AT FREE CLINIC HERE**  
 At the clinic held in the Community House on Tuesday morning 14 patients, most of them children were examined by Dr. A. B. Wickham of Eastman Sanitarium, Northville. This number of applicants is considered very good for a two-hour clinic, according to Miss Selpha Hale, executive secretary of the Oakland County Branch of the Michigan Tuberculosis Association which is sponsoring the clinic.

Examination by Dr. Wickham revealed two suspicious tuberculosis cases, a large number of diseased tonsils and teeth, and malnutrition. All the patients were referred to their family physicians for close follow-up care. It was suggested that another clinic be held in Birmingham in the fall.

**PLAT UNSETTLED**  
 Final decision on acceptance of the Tallapoosa tract was made again this week when it was found that the village officials had offered property owners would not agree as to the number of houses into which should be allowed in the territory. It will be discussed here hereafter.

**350 ACRES SEEK FALL ANNEXATION TO B'HAM**  
 An annexation petition for 350 acres of land, including all that territory outside of Birmingham west of the Monier road and north of the Clifton road, on the east side of Woodland avenue, has been filed with the county clerk at Pontiac. A similar petition to be circulated for six and two-thirds acres here of Chestnut Hill last week. The question of annexing these two parcels to Birmingham will be decided at the primary election to be held September 14.

**TWO FIRES LAST WEEK**  
 Two fires which cost the village of Birmingham \$112 and which were of no immediate danger to surrounding property brought the volunteer firemen together twice last week. One was in Southfield Township last Sunday morning with no damages. The other occurred Wednesday of last week; the cause being laid to a bonfire which spread over a grass field without any material damage to property owners.

**CLAIMS VILLAGE CAN'T CLOSE OAKLAND AVENUE**  
 Frank L. Doty, village attorney, in a legal opinion to the village commission Monday night, stated that the commission had no authority to close Oakland avenue between Adams avenue and Worth street, as asked for by members of the Northern Birmingham Civic Association. Mr. Doty's opinion held that the village could not close a highway unless it benefited the general public. It is believed that the Civic Association will engage legal talent to determine how far they can proceed to effect the desired closing.

**WATER FLOW STOPPED**  
 Unusually successful tests being conducted on Birmingham's new well, located on Lincoln avenue, west of Southfield avenue, Thursday of last week resulted in a shortage of water at the Birmingham Golf club's clubhouse. Operations were started at once to sink a pump in the club's well to take the place of the former natural flow.

**Local Business Man Announces Close Out**  
 Announcement was made late this week, by Fred Young, prominent Birmingham shoe merchant, to the effect that he will close out his entire local business immediately.
