Byrd's Boyhood Ambition Realized When He Flew Over North Pole

WHEN Commander R. B. Byrd flew his plane over the north pole he realized the dream of his boyhood days. He was the first to conquer by airplane the dreary, arctic wastes he had often longed to explore. For him it was a double triumph.

Wanderlust had his hand upon Byrd early in life. As a boy of 13 he longed to make a trip around the world.

He finally overcame the arguments of his mother, who opposed his roaming tendencies. He started from Richmond, Va., a city founded by his forefathers, and made his way overland to San Francisco where he caught a steamer for the Philippines.

Youngest Globe Trotter On ships he wandered from one Asiatic port to another, then came by liner to New York, where he was hailed as the youngest globe trotter in the world.

When Byrd was 15 years old he determined to reach the north pole four years later, while young Byrd was a student at Annapolis, Peary "spotted" it for the ambitious boy when he reached the pole. But Byrd was undismayed.

If the north pole had been discovered, there was one honor left for him to win. He would fly over it in a plane.

As he studied aviation, during his research he invented the "bubble."

The difficulty with youth today is that it doesn't accept responsibility as early in life as the preceding generations. Its battle for life doesn't start as soon as it used to start. Boys and girls are older now before they have to face the major tasks of earning their livings; consequently they do not accept responsibility as young in life. This is not a bad thing for it gives them a longer period of development before they undertake life's responsibilities. Youth is accepted as ready ally our institutions as they are. It would be better for the world if this generation were made up of other American generation in its mind and intelligence would make a more critical analysis of the institutions which it seems to be accepting without asking questions," concluded the preacher.

Promise a clean and decent contest. Will give the Governor credit for the good things he has done. Build roads cheaply and quickly. This calls for a leader who can work with men. Michigan is going to have a complete paved road system regardless of who is Governor. No man is indispensable. Highways to be built with cash, not hoped-for revenues. Highways for travel not votes? Highways should not be promised unless they are to be built. Highways for all Michigan rather than for those sections in which votes are most numerous. Million and a quarter spent on the cement plant might better have gone into building roads. Promptly paid contractors will make lower bids. Hasten Michigan's institutional program. Promptly pay monies due them. Under Administrative Board Act a strong man makes a dictatorship. A bad man finds limitless opportunities for dishonesty. Woman's prison to be actually completed more as a vocational rather than a penal institution remembering that although they may have committed a crime they are women and many of them mothers. State educational boards to be unhindered by the executive. Uphold all the constitution rather than that section only which gives the governor power to remove those officials who disagree with him. Enforce all law. Legislative rather than administrative to have power of appropriation. Abolish system of barter in legislation. Centralize responsibility but not power.
