Chancy Nixon, proprietor of Ery & Nixon's feed store: "The Eccentric played a joke on an acquaintance of mine a few weeks ago. He came across the statement that I was about to break ground for a handsome residence at Southside and asked someone else whether he had heard the news. The second man got the paper, read the announcement, and then looked at the heading, only to find that it was in the 45 years ago column."

Wright Needham, state policeman stationed in Birmingham: "We don't arrest drivers outside of the village for speeding if they can handle their cars correctly. It's only the people who sit in and out of the traffic that we are after and we arrest them on reckless driving charges, for that kind of driving is dangerous even on a wide road."
