Announcement will be made within a week of the names of 10 boys selected from Birmingham as delegates to the Older Boys conference at Jackson, Nov. 26 to 28, according to Robert Lynd, secretary of the Y. M. C. A. for Southern Oakland County. The conference will be under the auspices of Mr. Lynd's organization and will be attended by boys from all over the state.

Churches and the Hi-Y club of the village will have delegates to the conference, Mr. Lynd said and selection will be on the basis of leadership ability.
Dr. Thomas Graham of Oberlin College, and Dr. Frederick E. Taylor, of Indianapolis are among the numerous well-known men on the program for the three days session. Both will address the boys on subjects which have not yet been announced.

Group discussions will play a large part on the program. Under this head, those who attend will work out problems common to boys. All groups will be under the leadership of men students from Michigan colleges. These persons have been trained under the direction of A. J. Gregg of New York City.

About 100 boys from Oakland County will be present at the gathering while 50 are expected from the southern part of the county. One adult leader to every six boys will make the trip, according to plans. The age of the boys eligible will range from 16 to 20 years.

Aside from the serious part of the meetings to be held time has been set aside for recreation so the conference will not be one of all work and no play.
Meetings are to be held in the First Methodist Church at Jackson.




