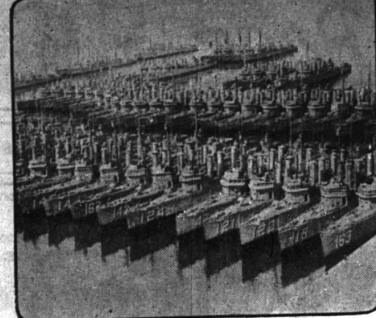

ESSEX INVADES LOW PRICE FIELD

As a result of its recent price cut, the Essex coach has become not only the lowest priced of all six cylinder enclosed cars, but has stepped decisively into the price field heretofore held exclusively by "fours," according to officials of Boughner Brothers dealers.

"When the Essex six was first introduced three years ago," they said, "the thought was sensational that a six cylinder closed car could be offered to the public reasonably since that time however, there have been remarkable price cuts.

Essex has made just less than a third of a million coaches on its six cylinder chassis in the three years since its introduction."

UNITED STATES TOBACCO POPULAR IN ENGLAND

If the United States is worried by the fact that Great Britain dominates the crude rubber market of the world, Britain, in turn, is worried about the American tobacco monopoly.

"Puff Our Own" has become an empire slogan in an endeavor to destroy America's grip on the world. Much effort is being expended toward popularizing the tobacco grown in the British Colonies, but thus far patriotism has not made great headway against taste. Englishmen prefer Virginia tobacco. And, although great strides in tobacco culture have been made in the British Colonies they cannot as yet produce Virginia tobacco. By some freak of fate the climatic and soil conditions of Virginia are the only ones under which that golden yellow tobacco with its subtle aroma can grow. Patriotic Britshers, however, do not despair of eventually raising tobacco within the empire that will dominate the home market as completely as American tobacco does at present.

Britain spends \$600,000,000 a year on tobacco, and she buys 50 per cent of it from the United States. The British imported 182,000,000 pounds of tobacco last year, of which 157,000,000 pounds came from America. The taxes on this tobacco yielded 7 per cent of the total national revenue, and paid the entire cost of the National Government for three weeks.

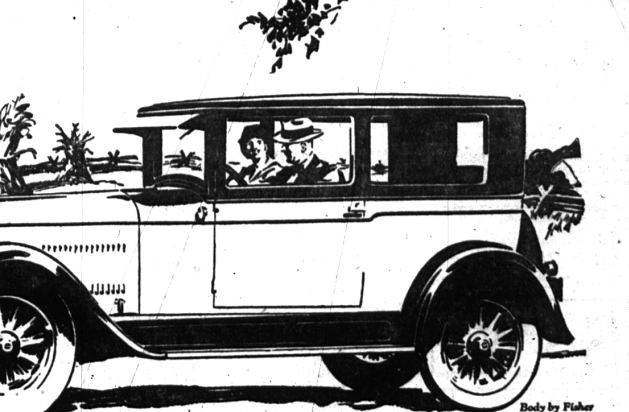
