BOARD OF EDUCATION

Birmingham, Michigan, November 9, 1926.

The regular meeting of the Board of Education was called to order at 8 p. m.

Present: R. J. Coryell, Leigh Lynch, Fred V. Querton, Ray A. Palmer and J. W. Parry.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Moved by Lynch supported by Palmer that the Board of Education shall secure an option till August 1, 1927 on the following description of land:

Part of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 36, Township 2 North, Range 19 East, described as follows: Commencing at the center of said Section 36, thence North 1 degree east 87.67 feet; thence South 39 degrees 43 minutes East 50 feet to the place of beginning; thence North 0 degrees 22 minutes West 290 feet; thence East 89 degrees 43 minutes East 50 feet; thence South 0 degrees 22 minutes East 290 feet; thence North 38 degrees 43 minutes West 50 feet to the point of beginning, said property being a lot 50 x 200 facing on Frank street and adjacent to the west side of the Barnum school site.

Moved and seconded the bill be allowed. Carried.


