Dear Mr. Penny—

In response to your inquiry in connection with a zoning law for Birmingham, and with specific reference to the mortgage held by our company upon a residence owned by your family:

It is my belief that a zoning law would in no manner endanger the security for this mortgage. This opinion has been endorsed by several officers of the Trust Company with whom I have discussed a zoning law for Birmingham. Contrarywise, I believe that the security for our mortgage, in this particular case, will be rendered even more stable through the adoption of a properly drawn zoning law.

Generally speaking, and looking at the question from a standpoint of the investing of capital in first mortgages, I believe a zoning law of material benefit to a district. I would be more inclined to recommend a long time mortgage on residential property where the general environment had been established by law.

The general feeling of most of the officers of our company is to consider Birmingham as a "home" community and not to look upon it as an industrial center. I believe a zoning law would further this idea.
