THE SPINAL COLUMN
Scoliosis or Lateral Curvature—a common Deformity
The purpose of this article is to convey, as briefly and as clearly as possible, some idea of the condition attending a common deformity of the Spinal Column known as Scoliosis or Lateral Curvature, and the difficulties surrounding the treatment of the same, and to impress the necessity in such a case of immediate and rational attention.
The anatomy and the functions of the Spinal Column are not so occult as that of the brain and the nervous system, yet the shape of the twenty-four movable bones of which the spine is composed, the manner with which they articulate with their neighbors above and below, present a marvelous construction, especially when the ligaments, cords, and muscles, constitute the most wonderful piece of engineering ever seen by man.
The Spinal Column serves as a pillar supporting the entire body above the hips, and an incessant vigilance is required to maintain an equilibrium. As every breath the center of gravity is changed, and there seems to be an ever present watchfulness on the part of the nerves, through the muscles, to keep the body in the position desired. Any interference with the innervation of the muscles of the back is very apt to cause a disturbance in their equilibrium. An undue contraction, for example, of the muscles of one side of the Spine will have the tendency to pull the vertebrae towards that side, thus producing a curvature. It may also result from unequality in the length of the legs, from habitual assumption of a posture, from trauma, from adhesions, from unilateral affection of the lung, while a small percentage is congenital.
STRUCTURAL CHANGES:
The deformity usually has progressed to a considerable extent before it is noticed. In its incipency the symptoms will be scarcely detected by the casual observer, and thus it will continue developing until any one may see that one shoulder of the child is a little larger than the other, or that one hip is more prominent than the other, or that the Spine does not seem to be in the center of the back. In marked Scoliosis of long duration the anatomical changes in the Spine are pronounced. The vertebrae and the ribs are pressed together on the concave side whereas on the convex side the ribs spread apart. There is an undue contraction of the muscles upon the convex side and relaxation upon the opposite side. The ligaments become shortened upon the concave side and elongated upon the convex. The above changes are followed by a change in the shape of the thorax or the abdomen, depending upon the location of the deformity, with inevitable visceral tendencies. Thus the lungs, the heart, the stomach, the intestines, or other organs may become compressed and their function impaired undermining thereby the health of the sufferer.
Scoliosis of the Spinal Column is progressive, and the longer the deformity continues the more difficult and obstinate will its correction become.
The facts are that the spine is seldom examined, and that the tailor is called upon to exercise ingenuity to hide any slight deformity from the popular gaze. It goes on from bad to worse until the body is deformed for life.
To the question, "will he or she grow out of it?" the reply is, that spontaneous cure is neither to be expected nor relied upon. If curvature exists I suggest that you investigate my method. As a spine specialist I can tell you the possibilities of its correction.
