Detroit, Sept. 28.—The Republican convention held in Detroit Tuesday of this week comprised part of 888 delegates who almost unanimously supported the nomination of Charles W. Green, standard bearer and gubernatorial candidate, Fred W. Green, Jr., for state attorney general, and Alex J. Groesbeck a slight majority in the Oakland vote.

Green, standard bearer and gubernatorial candidate, Fred W. Green, Jr., for state attorney general, and Alex J. Groesbeck a slight majority in the Oakland vote.

Potter Nominated

W. W. Potter, the choice of the Green forces, was given the Republican nomination for attorney general by the party State convention. He was opposed by Andrew B. Daugherty, incumbent. Daugherty was a member of the Greenback group. The nomination of Potter was a distinct victory for Green and his followers.

Justice Ernest Snow, of the State Supreme Court, was elected without opposition. Although he was a Greenback appointee, Mayor Greenberg nominated Judge Walter H. North, of Calhoun County, without opposition.
