Auto Authority Gives Cold Weather Tip

Here is a cold weather tip from an authority on automobile service. R. A. Armstrong, director of service for the Oakland Motor Car Company, said that installation of louvre covers on the inside of engine hoods in cold weather is advised by Mr. Armstrong, even on cars equipped with devices for controlling radiator and engine temperatures. Both gasoline mileage and engine performance are improved by louvre covers, he declares.

Satisfactory covers can be cut from ordinary card board and should be attached to close the louvre openings by cord or wire tied around the rim of the louvres. Cold air thus is prevented from entering the engine compartment.

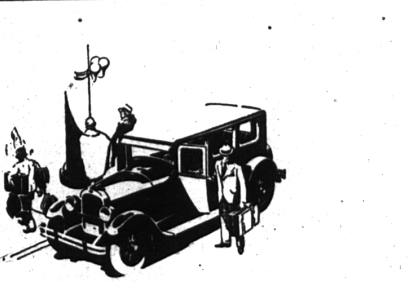
