**GREEN GAVE ADDRESS
IN PONTIAC SUNDAY**
Republican Candidate For Governor
Favors State Good
Roads
That he stands for the building of good roads where they are needed most in Michigan, including a hasty completion of Wider Woodward avenue in Oakland County, was the substance of a speech made last Sunday by Fred W. Green, Republican candidate for Governor at the September 14 Primary Election. Mr. Green told his audience that Michigan's good roads will be extended regardless of who is Governor; if elected he will not only continue the good roads program, but will also see that the people of Michigan are given a proper accounting of the money expended, he said.
"People Demand More Roads."
"Roads will be built because the people want them; because they must have them in this day of motor-travel. If I am elected governor I propose to build just as many roads as the finances of the state will permit, and I want to assure you that they will be built economically, with statements of all costs wide open for the world to see, and they will be built in accordance with a definite program. They will be located where they will do the most good for the commonwealth and not just where votes may be had."
His remarks were in sharp contrast with policies of the Grovesbeck administration which has shrouded road costs in secrecy and has failed to explain enormous expenditures such as \$74,000 per mile on the Dixie and \$52,000 on Grand River through Oakland County, when original bids approximated \$30,000.
Hits State Campaigners
Green took a crack at the vigorous campaigning that has been done for the governor's fourth term nomination by state employees.
"The governor should be the servant of the people, and not their master," Green continued. "If the people of this state honor me by placing me in the chief executive's office it will be my purpose to try to serve them, not to order them; to see that existing laws are obeyed, not set aside at my own caprice."

"I believe the sheriff's office should co-operate in every way with the police departments of the many municipalities of the county. The present administration has failed in this respect.
"I advocate a school for instruction of deputies entering the service and would, if elected, inaugurate such a school. At present deputies enter the service without training.
"A more efficient and economical administration of the fiscal affairs of the office is needed.
"I address my appeal to the Christian and moral-thinking citizens and am expecting them to nominate me for sheriff of Oakland County, September 14 in the primaries."
