PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE BUSY

Mrs. Marson Establishes Charts; Surveys To Be Made

Mrs. Pearl Marson, Birmingham public health nurse, is established today in the new permanent headquarters of the board of health, on the second floor of the Village Office building, at Tenth and Martin streets. Mrs. Marson is in her third week of active work as public health nurse.

Plans are under way at present for a milk chart, on which will be kept a record, taken at regular intervals, of the quality of milk supplied by the various creameries. All milk used in Birmingham will be examined and recorded, and the records will be open to public examination.

Tests of one meat sold in the various meat markets will also be made, and a record kept. Present plans are to place a card recording the rating in the windows of the markets.

So far Mrs. Marson has been busy examining both children and adults and diagnosing their ailments, and taking care of families quarantined with contagious diseases. In the past week Mrs. Marson has released four homes which were in quarantine, after

having examined the patients, to see that they were cured and the persons near to them who might have been infected.

Infectious diseases at this time of year are not common, Mrs. Marson said. The winter months bring them in greater numbers, she explained.

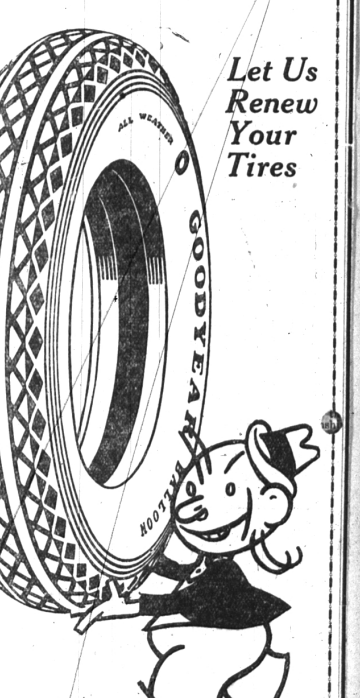
