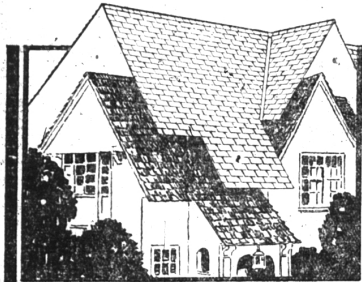

Railway Will Accommodate
250 Cars In Siding At
Yellow Coach Plant

Work will begin immediately on a new 250-car storage yard at the new Yellow Coach and Truck Manufacturing Company on South Boulevard, Pontiac, W. R. Davidson, assistant general manager, announced Friday. The yard will be built along the D. G. H. & M. tracks to the north of the power house of the plant, Mr. Davidson explained.

Five sidings, each approximately 2,500 feet long, will be included in the yard, making about two and one-half miles.
Mr. Davidson visited Pontiac Friday, making a thorough inspection of the Yellow plant site and the new belt line railroad. On the latter he stated, construction was proceeding satisfactorily.

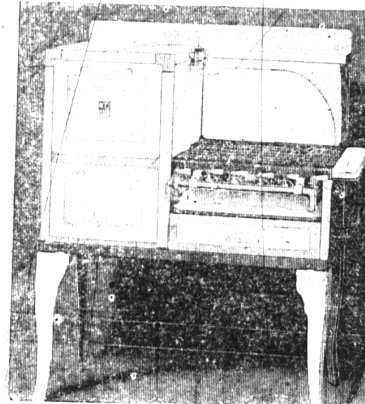

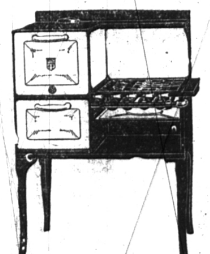

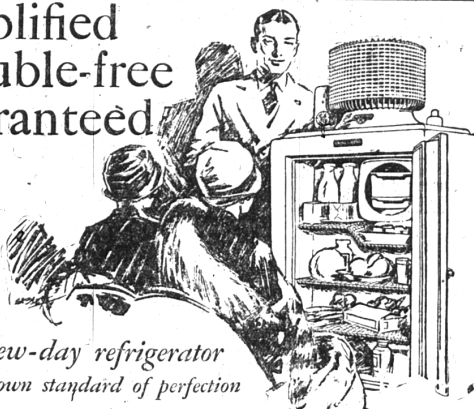
