The library also will start today to move to the new building.

Plans are being completed by Manager James W. Parry for temporary quarters for the fire department, the third grade department in the church building at Woodward and Maple avenues.

The house the police department will occupy has seven rooms and a garage. The offices and first aid station will be on the first floor and the basement will be used for storage.

Another officer will be added to the force about the time the station is moved, Chief Anderson said. He plans on having the new man do night patrol duty. This will make the total members of the force 10.

An additional call box will be placed at Woodward and Maple avenues upon the removal of the department, the Chief plans.

(Continued from Page 1) which the First National Bank is located.

On the south side, however, his plan calls for the widening to the maximum of five feet which would be reached at the corner of Hamilton avenue and the Grand Trunk tracks. The north side would graduate down from a 10-foot widening at Woodward to a five foot widening at the tracks. Each side would be proportionately widened.

The width of the street now is 50 feet. The roadway is 20 feet wide. Mr. Parry favors a 40 foot roadway and says this is far more efficient than a 32 foot roadway.

"Traffic conditions on Hamilton avenue soon will necessitate a wide pavement," he said. "A 40 foot roadway would allow for parallel parking on both sides of the street and at the same time three lines of moving traffic."

An estimate of the cost of the widening probably will be presented to the commission next Monday night, said Mr. Parry.

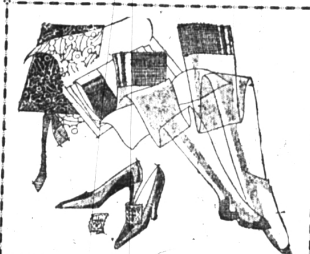

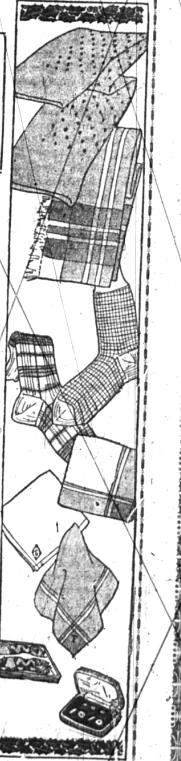
