

YELLOW COACH STARTS JAN. 15

Plan To Open Doors Of New General Motors Plant In Township

Manufacturing is planned to be started in the new plant of the Yellow Truck & Coach company, South boulevard, Pontiac, Bloomfield Township soon after Dec. 15, the date set for the opening of the doors, according to H. J. Warner, manager of the Pontiac plant of the General Motors.

"The body division will start moving on Dec. 15," Mr. Warner said "and each division will start work in the new plant as fast as the equipment can be installed."

According to the present schedule of plans the moving of the Pontiac divisions to the new plant will not be completed until late in January or early in February. Moving of the Chicago divisions to the new plant will start on Feb. 15, Mr. Warner said.

Body Division First

The first division to move from the old Pontiac plant to the new South boulevard plant will be the body division and this will be closely followed by the frame division. Next will come the engine division and then in regular order, the major assemblies, chassis line, dynamos, tests, washing and painting division, final assembly, special equipment division, body mounting division, export division, export boxing division and shipping division.

Several divisions will still remain at the present General Motors Truck company plant on Rappling street and chief among these will be the engineering division which includes the experimental departments.

Other divisions to remain are the service division, chassis machine room and model body department.

Village Schools Receive Praise

Superintendent Tells Of Baldwin Rating Among Other Educational Centers

Letters of commendation of the high school at Baldwin, Ala., at the University of Michigan, who were graduated from Baldwin High School, are being received by school officials here.

Baldwin High School has been accredited since 1881, being one of the first schools of the state to reach the necessary requirements. Clarence Vliet, superintendent and 10 members of both the North Central association and of the schools accredited by the University of Michigan.

No suggestions or criticisms have been made by the last inspectors, as every effort is put forth by the school board to live up to the requirements, he said. Reports to the associations are made each year on the course of study, the library and laboratory equipment, and the training and success of the teachers.

Since each school in the state must justify itself in the work of its graduate students, each college sends a report to Baldwin High School of the work done by its freshmen students, he said these reports are always closely followed, Mr. Vliet explained.
