

7,000 BOOKS ARE REMOVED

Shelves Of Volumes Taken To New Library As Old Building Is Vacated

More than 7,000 books were moved from the old library to the new building on Martin and Bates streets, this week, Mrs. Nancy B. Thomas, librarian, said. The new library opens for business, Dec. 15.

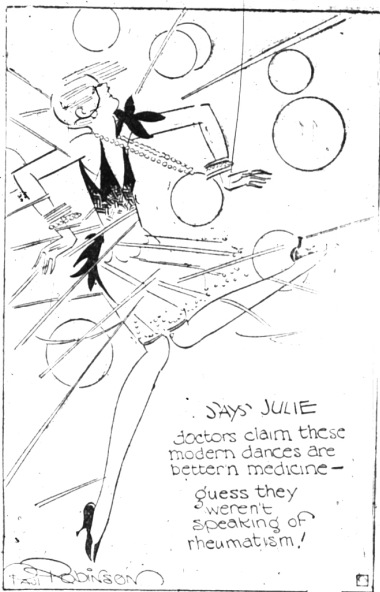
The moving was done systematically and with as little handling of the books as possible. Each shelf of books at the old building was packed in order and sent to the new building where it was

placed in the order on the shelves, Mrs. Thomas explained. Precious to moving, much time and effort was expended cataloguing the new books and making the old ones presentable. The large labels were removed from the old books making them more attractive. The task of cataloguing the new books took much time. Five record cards for each book were typed, the pocket and book card were typed and the pocket and book mark were pasted in the book before the task was completed, Mrs. Thomas said.

More than 400 books, about equally divided between the adult and children's departments, were catalogued during the past two weeks, she said.

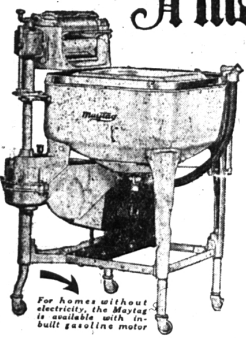
