Moved by Commissioner Hulbert that the following resolution be adopted: That the Village Commission be authorized to accept the offer of the Birmingham and Northern Railway Company...

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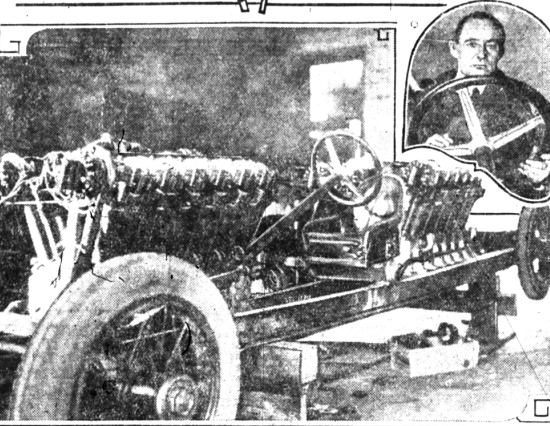
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SPEED DEMON RARIN' TO BURN UP COUNTRY ROADS
