TRACKSTERS NOSED OUT

Baldwin Thinsclads Lose To Highland Park By One Point

Failure to win in the relay event at Birmingham a victory in the indoor track meet at Highland Park Monday afternoon. In the early events of the meet, the Baldwin tracksters established a large margin of points over the Highland crew but this was cut down later when Highland Park scored slams in the half-mile and mile runs. The result of the meet was generally decided by the relay as the points stood: Highland Park, 41; Birmingham, 40, before the start was run. The final score was 46-40.

On the dashes and hurdles, the opening events, Coach A. L. Van Winkle's men had their own way and took firsts and seconds in both the 25 yard dash and the 50 yard hurdles and a first in the 25 yard high hurdles. Likewise in the pole-vault first and second places were filled by Marmonclad men. Open firsts were gained in the 40 yard dash and the high jump, giving Birmingham six major honors and Highland Park four. The home aggregation was well bolstered with seconds however having six out of the ten events rebounded. Third place positions were almost entirely filled by the Highland Parkers, Birmingham gaining only one.

Milton Porteous was the high point man of the meet having gained firsts in three events, the 100 yard dash, the 220 yard dash and the 110 yard high hurdles. Williams was next with nine points, having won the high jump and tied for first with Berger in the pole vault. Carter accumulated eight points by making a first in the 25 yard high hurdles and a second in the 50 yard high hurdles. Moseley of Highland Park ranked high in points also, by winning the 27 1/2 yard dash and placing second in the 25 yard dash besides running in the relay team.

The mile run was won by Sam Sleen, captain of the Polar Bears and the half mile run was won by Schmidt.

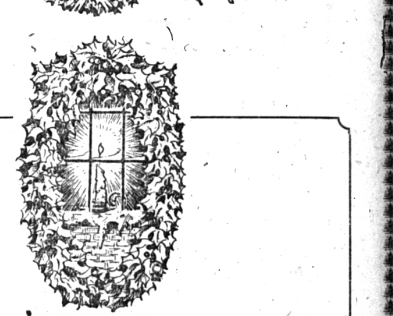
