HOW to Achieve Beauty

Your First New Year Beauty Resolution Should Be Cleanliness

Yesterday I told you that the first fundamental principle of beauty was cleanliness. That may seem a broad statement, but I do not mean mere soap and water cleanliness.

There are two kinds of cleanliness, both of which are tremendously important to beauty. First there is the internal cleanliness which means keeping your system in perfect order. If you neglect this, the outfit balances the intake of oxygen. The composition of the body is bound to show itself in skin cleanliness, a sad reflection of the internal condition.

The best precaution against constipation is to drink two or three glasses of water before breakfast, and two or three glasses of water a day. Drink one before you go to bed at night.

Be sure that your diet is well balanced and that you eat plenty of vegetables and not too much meat.

Now we come to external cleanliness. I am going to skip over the subject of baths and get down to the fundamentals of keeping your face clean. You cannot scrub it with soap like a small boy. Its cleanliness is much more complicated than that. First, you must dry out its natural oils with a harsh, alkaline soap. For however much you apply oil to your skin, you cannot replace the natural oils. Use instead a penetrating wash or soap substitute that gets deep down into the pores and purges them of impurities. If your skin is oily, a wash in the form of little beauty grains will help regulate the functioning of the relaxed oil glands and so reduce the oiliness. However, this is very far from the harsh drying out of the natural oils that an alkaline soap will do.

Then every skin needs cleansing with a cream. However, let me warn you not to think that a cold cream is good for you just because it is a cold cream. Don't choose your cream because you like its fragrance, or because a friend uses it, or you have seen it advertised a great deal. Get a cream that is definitely made for the purpose for which you are going to use it. There are cleansing creams and antiwrinkle creams and corrective creams. Buy your cream because you want it to cleanse or to cool or to refresh your skin, and use it only for the purpose for which it was intended. Secondly, choose your cream according to the type of your skin. A light, fluffy, oily cream is best for the dry skin. For the oily skin, you should get a cream made by a pasteurized process that will definitely aid in correcting the oiliness.

For the oily skin that you have such a hard-time keeping clean, bathe the face several times a day with a cooling lotion to erase the shine and freshen up the skin. Your first beauty resolution, then, will be cleanliness. Tomorrow, I am going to talk to you about "Resolve to Employ the Principle of Stimulation For Beauty."

To Serve Cream Cheese Rub fine, moisten with melted butter, if desired, and sour or sweet cream. Shape and sprinkle with paprika. Should you want a simple dessert this is a way to fix it: Pour any favorite preserves over the cheese or form a hole in the center and fill with jelly and serve with crisp wafers.

QUEEN MARIE OF ROUMANIA SHOWS SHE LIKES AMERICAN FOOD

A handbook of American cookery, tucked away in one of the 45 royal trunks that trailed behind Queen Marie of Rumania on her trip to the United States last year, may result in changing the diet habits of that nation, according to word received by social leaders who helped entertain the Queen while in America. The Queen became so fond of American cooking on her visit here that she had the book translated into Rumanian and put it in the hands of the palace chef. One by one the elaborate national and French recipes and methods of preparation graced the royal table are being replaced by simpler, more wholesome American dishes.

With the Americanization of the Rumanian diet in prospect, one may soon expect to find fried chicken and cream gravy and sweet potatoes, chicken a la king, waffles, baked beans and other typically American dishes in the average Rumanian home or restaurant. Ham and eggs are said to be the favorites of Prince Nicholas, who accompanied his mother last year, while the Princess Ileana prefers griddle cakes swimming in butter and maple syrup. The Queen is said to have acquired a pronounced taste for American butter and maple syrup, wherever possible, be cooked in this product of the cow.

The chief difference between the national diet of Rumania and America is that ours is simpler and lighter in character, containing less starch and heavy protein and more of the mineral foods and butter. The butter consumption of Rumania is one of the lowest in Europe, averaging only about six pounds per capita against 17 pounds which every man, woman and child in America has come to him every year.

BRUSH UP THE OLD FUR COAT

Must last year's fur coat do service this winter? Perhaps a cleaning will improve its appearance. To do this take the coat outdoors and, with a stiff whisk broom brush with the nap. Then rub it well with a clean cloth saturated with gasoline, after which use the workroom to restore the nap and hang in the sun to dry. Never try to clean fur with water, as this will shrivel the hide.

If your coat is of dark fur and looks dull, just put a very little brillianite on a soft, clean brush and go over the coat gradually with this. Colored fur can be cleaned by rubbing it with equal parts of alcohol and salt (warm) when brushing it thoroughly. In case your fur coat gets wet, do not try to dry it by heat. Hang

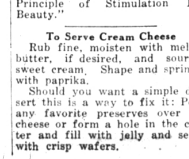
