SCHOOL BANDS GET UNIFORMS

Director of Adams and Baldwin Musicians Promises Suit For Players Before Spring

Arnold W. Bernitt, Birmingham public school band and orchestra director, will have both the Baldwin and Adams bands uniformed before spring, and possibly before the close of the basketball season, he says.

The Baldwin uniform will be of a good grade of khaki cloth, in cap, cape and trousers, with possibly some color. The uniform of the Adams band will probably be a cap and cape in the school colors, purple and gold, with trousers furnished by the students.

Mr. Bernitt announced Monday the appointment of Oak DeBerg, of the 10th grade, as drum major for the Baldwin team. DeBerg will have charge of the organization at athletic contests at which Mr. Bernitt is unable to be present, and will take the accustomed place at the head of the band in parade formation.

The band will probably appear at basketball games this season. If not, at all the home games, the organization will appear at the Royal Oak game, at which the new Cass School gymnasium will be dedicated.

New sets of music are now being ordered for both the Adams band and orchestra. The Baldwin group will continue with the advanced music now in use.

Mr. Bernitt has developed musical organizations in each of the five Birmingham schools, and will probably form an organization in the new Quenton School. He is working with sixth grade students to perfect them for the junior high and high school musical groups.

Workman First Uses Telescope At Cranbrook

A 4-inch telescope is now in use in the observatory tower at Cranbrook school. It is the property of J. Walter Drake, of Detroit, until recently assistant secretary of the observatory under Herbert Hoover.

Mr. Drake has loaned it to the school until the arrival of the telescope now being made for the Cranbrook student's use. It was manufactured by Brantford, Pittsburgh, noted astronomical manufacturer now working on Cranbrook's 6-inch refractor telescope.

Angelo Papa, a workman employed at the school was the first person to look through the telescope from the top of Cranbrook tower.

Judge Henry S. Herbert, Judge of Probate for Wayne County, himself an amateur astronomer, has been supervising the installation of the Cranbrook equipment.

Judge Hulbert asked if Angelo knew that it was a countryman of his who invented the telescope. Angelo did. "Then," said Judge Hulbert, "I am going to let you have the honor of first looking at the stars through a telescope from Cranbrook's observatory tower."
