County Wide Sale of Seals To End On Christmas Day

Returns in the county-wide Christmas seal sale for the Oakland County Tuberculosis association were reported yesterday by the coming in of a "rainy" day. The quota is \$10,000 for the county and the drive ends Christmas Day.

The itinerary and sheets of a number of new diagnostic chest clinics in the county are already being made up. Mrs. Zappella B. Hale, executive secretary, announced the program calls for three such clinics to be held in the county, she said. Definite announcements regarding their locations and the time of meeting will be made later.

Mrs. Hale was enthusiastic over the progress of the sale. "Oakland County residents are more and more appreciating the work of the Tuberculosis association," she said, "and are showing their appreciation by their cooperation with our seal sale and by attention to the clinics."

"During the next year the association will endeavor to inspire more interest throughout the county in local and county medical services," Mrs. Hale said. "We advise that a family physician be resorted to when the need demands rather than selecting physicians at random for minor medical attention. If a physician is familiar with the family he will be able to render service more quickly in an emergency. If he should decide that a case needs the attention of a specialist then he will be able to refer the person to one. We want Oakland County residents to appreciate the medical service offered them in their own community."

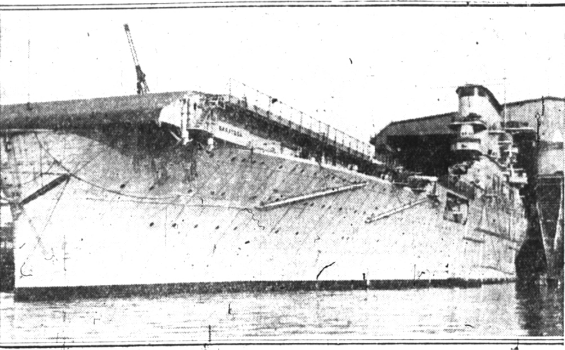
The Tuberculosis association works hand in hand with the county health department in prevention and treatment of the white plague in the county. The work of both organizations is linked with the County Tuberculosis Hospital. The county health department had 880 cases of tuberculosis under its direct control during the last year while the Tuberculosis association discovered 30 new cases of the disease.

The county health department conducts one permanent tuberculosis clinic, held twice a week for examination, instruction and treatment. The Tuberculosis association conducted 28 diagnostic chest clinics during the past year.

Taxpayers On Latham Boulevard Asked To Discuss With Commission

Objections to the method of taxation for the laying of a concrete curb and gutter on Latham boulevard from Lincoln avenue to Savon drive will be heard at the village offices by the commission, Dec. 19, at 8 p. m. It was decided following the report on costs for the improvement submitted Monday night by Manager James W. Parry.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$6,094. All lots and parcels of land fronting on Latham boulevard are included in the special assessment district and will be taxed five-sixths of the cost of construction. The village at large will pay the other one-sixth.
