### Birmingham Sales Room Is Crowded by Curious On Opening Day

## 200 ORDERS ARE TAKEN

Approximately 200 Ford orders have been placed with Frank W. Conant, Birmingham dealer, since the car was placed on exhibit here last week, according to announcements today.

Between 700 and 800 persons attended the public reception held in the new sales room on South Woodward avenue last Friday, opening day, as part of the national reception of the new Ford models. Each day the sales force here been kept busy explaining the picture display, Mr. Conant said.

The date set for deliveries has not been learned by this date, but he expects it to be within the month. This will depend entirely upon production at the plant, he explained.

The new models have been received with the greatest enthusiasm, Mr. Conant said. Birmingham residents crowded the building Saturday evening when they heard that a car had been placed there for storage for a short time. Mr. Conant said that his recent visit in the new car was the most thrilling that he had ever experienced. The performance of the motor was better than he had expected that it could be, he said.

It is expected that his new building will be completed in three weeks.
