

FORMER PRESIDENT DIES IN DETROIT

Edward J. Kinnisten Operated a Bakery Here Years Ago

Passing of Edward J. Kinnisten, a resident of Detroit for the past 15 years, at his home, 5025 Seibert avenue, recalls the fact that Mr. Kinnisten came to Birmingham 30 years ago from Parkhill, Ontario, and operated a bakery where the Johnson-Shaw block now stands.

He was an active member of the Baptist Church and took a great interest in the village affairs, especially the opening of the electric line from Detroit to Farmington.

After closing out his business here, he moved to Detroit and became connected with the Cadillac Motor car company, in whose company he remained until his death.

Services were conducted by Rev. Gilbert A. North from the home. He was buried in Grand Lawn cemetery last week.

He is survived by his widow, Rachel, and one son, Kenneth.
