We are not in favor of the zoning ordinance, neither are we in favor of the amendment to the building code which is to be voted upon at this election. It being a part of the zoning ordinance which was so overwhelmingly defeated by the voters a few months ago. We stand squarely for a larger commission which has been needed for some time, and if elected we will endeavor to administer the affairs of the village in a manner above criticism.

Many have congratulated Mr. Ellery on his agreement to qualify for the president's office. He will be in opposition to W. W. Henry of north Woodward avenue. With Mr. Stanley's withdrawal from the race citizens will decide between these two candidates.

# ELECTION NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at the general election to be held in the Village of Birmingham, at the following precincts: Precinct No. 1, corner of Harmon and Woodward Avenues; Precinct No. 2, Village Commission Rooms; Precinct No. 3, corner of Lincoln and Woodward Avenues, on

## Monday the 14th Day of March, 1927, A.D.

between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A. M. and 8:30 o'clock P.M., Central Standard Time, the qualified electors shall vote upon the following Propositions:

### PROPOSITION 1.

Shall sections 1 to 13 inclusive, of Chapter 24 of the Revised Charter of the Village of Birmingham be amended to read as follows:

#### CHAPTER XXIV Recall of Elective Officers Who May Be Recalled

Sections 1 to 13 inclusive be amended to read as follows: Section 1. Any holder of an elective office may be recalled and removed therefrom by the qualified electors of the Village of Birmingham in the manner now or which at any time may be provided by the general law of the State of Michigan.

### PROPOSITION 2.

Shall sections 1 and 2, Chapter 5, and Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 9, of the Revised Charter of the Village of Birmingham be amended to read as follows (7 men commission):

#### CHAPTER V Officers to Be Elected

Section 1. There shall be elected at large in the Village the following officers, viz: one President, six Commissioners and one Clerk.

Section 2. The Clerk shall be elected for a term of one year. The President and the six Commissioners shall each be elected for a term of two years.

The terms of office of all elective officers shall commence at 12:00 o'clock noon, standard time, on the third Monday of March following their election; provided, however, that a special election shall be called under this amendment for the purpose of electing four Commissioners, such special election shall be called within sixty days after the adoption of this amendment and the terms of the two Commissioners receiving the greatest number of votes shall end on the third Monday of March, 1927, and the terms of the two Commissioners receiving the next highest number of votes shall end on the third Monday of March, 1928.

At the next regular election after the adoption of this amendment, a President, Clerk and three Commissioners shall be elected and thereafter a President shall be elected at each regular annual election and a Clerk and three Commissioners shall be elected at each regular annual election.

All officers shall hold office until their successors are elected and have qualified.

### CHAPTER IX COMMISSION

#### Composition and Powers

Section 1. All the powers of the Village, except as herein otherwise provided, are hereby vested in the Commission which shall consist of a President and six Commissioners to be elected at large.

#### Quorum

Section 2. Four members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a lesser number may meet and adjourn from time to time and all pending business and business noticed or set down for hearing at such meeting shall be taken up and heard at such adjourned meeting or at the next regular meeting without further notice.

### PROPOSITION 3.

The Village of Birmingham Ordains that no motion picture theatre or place of commercialized amusement shall operate or be open to the public within the Village without a license from the Village; that no license shall be issued for Sunday operation; that no such theatre or place of amusement shall be open on Sunday; that each and every license issued shall be upon the express condition that if the licensee permits the theatre or place of amusement for which the license is issued to operate or open to the public on Sunday, or if said theatre or place of amusement is so operated or opened to the public on Sunday, then the license thereby shall be revoked, forfeited, and become null and void, and the licensee shall be fined \$100.00 or imprisoned in the County Jail, or both, for each and every violation of this Ordinance.

### PROPOSITION 4.

The Village of Birmingham Ordains: That Section 2, Article 6 of Ordinance 104 be amended by adding thereto paragraph "C" as follows:

#### Article 6—Miscellaneous

Section 2. Dwelling. Location. (c) Any building not used for dwelling purposes, that may be erected in any locality, outside of a recognized commercial district where existing structures are used only for dwellings must conform to the requirements of paragraphs "A" and "B" of this section.

Penalty for violation of this Ordinance shall be as provided by Ordinance No. 104.

All of which is in accordance with the Resolution adopted by the Village Commission of the Village of Birmingham, at their meeting held on the 21st day of February, 1927. A. H. of which the following is a true copy: Moved by President Spain that the following preamble and Resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Village Commission deems it advisable to amend Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 5, and Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 9 of the Revised Charter of the Village of Birmingham.

WHEREAS, the Village Commission deems it advisable to submit to the electors of said Village the question of adoption of a proposed Ordinance in reference to the prohibiting of moving picture theaters and other commercialized amusements being operated on Sundays.

WHEREAS, the Village Commission deems it advisable to amend Section 2, Article 6, Ordinance 104, entitled "Building Code."

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the question of amending Sections 1 to 13 inclusive, Chapter 24, of the Revised Charter of the Village of Birmingham be submitted to the voters of the Village for their approval as Proposition 1; and Be It Further Resolved, that the question of amending Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 5, and Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 9, of the Revised Charter of the Village of Birmingham be submitted to the electors of the Village of Birmingham for their approval as Proposition 2. Be It Further Resolved, that the question of amending Section 2, Article 6, Ordinance 104, entitled "Building Code" by adding paragraph "C" be submitted to the electors of the Village as Proposition 4. That

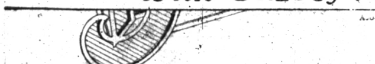
