Englishman's Suit of \$255,000 Against Turks Soon To Be Heard

The case of Anthony Edwards, Englishman, who is suing the Turkish Government for \$255,000 for wrongful seizure of real estate and damages by occupying troops to his island of Smyrna...

Anthony Edwards himself was content to visit it a few times during his lifetime. On his death in 1882 it passed into the hands of his son, who survived his father by only a few years. The grandson also named Anthony, decided to cultivate and develop his inheritance.

Uzun Adassi is eighteen miles from Izmir three and one-half miles long and two wide. The climate is cool and salubrious all the year around, the soil is fertile, and vines, tobacco, almonds, olives, etc., are raised and can be profitably grown.

Toward the end of the last century Ottoman Greek peasants from the mainland settled there; and by 1914 some 2,000 were living on the island. In 1914, when the Greek army entered Smyrna, the Turkish authorities about Izmir, and the island, were in a dispute with the peasants and with the Turkish authorities about rents, taxes and other matters.

When Kiam'd Pasha, afterward Grand Vizier, became Governor General of the vilayet, Edwards was advised to sell the island to Turkey, which wanted it because of its position. The negotiations for this came to nothing, however, as the Turks offered far less than Edwards was willing to accept.

At the close of the war it seemed as if Uzun Adassi was to pass forever out of the Edwards family. Temporary help arrived with the Greek Army, which landed at Smyrna, and the island was immediately placed in Edward's hands. Pasha made a list of the island's resources, including a small settlement of Greek troops, which were to be removed.
