Marshall will long live as a famous figure in the minds of Californians for the rapid settlement and development of this state dates to his discovery of gold. While working in the sawmill of General Sutter at Coloma on January 24, 1848, Marshall discovered a shiny piece of yellow metal in the mill-race. He made his discovery known

and immediately the cry of gold was on everybody's lips. Fortune hunters came to California from the east in great herds and the territory around Coloma was a seething mass of humanity digging for gold.

Mined Discoveries. Marshall's discovery led to explorations and discoveries elsewhere in the state and the settlement of California became general.

But Coloma, like other mine boom towns, presents a different scene today. There is nothing but memories and ruins of buildings famous in the early days. Two

of these old buildings are the banks, built of stone and iron, that set at the western edge of the town. Many millions of dollars passed through these in the early days.

At Coloma the visitor may spend all the time he wishes seeking out the historical and interesting objects. The main thing, of course, is the monument erected on a hill overlooking the town in honor of Marshall. On the monument base is the figure of Marshall with arm pointing down to the gravel bar in the American River where he discovered the first nugget.

There is a narrow road that winds up the hillside to the monument.

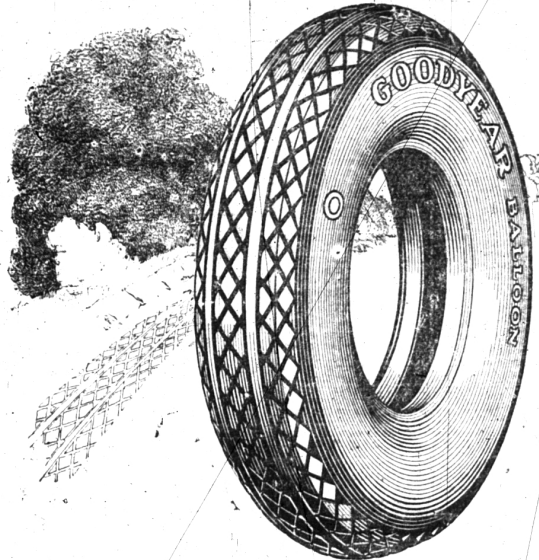
