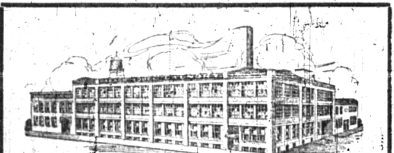
RESERVES FIND ROCHESTER EASY
