

MORE ACTIVITY BY POLICE IS SHOWN IN 1926 REPORT

437 More Arrests Made Than During Previous 12 Months

SPEEDING ON DECLINE

Although the number of arrests at Tippecanoe Co. Service, \$21,000 made by the Birmingham Police Department during 1926 is greater by 437 than the number for 1925...

Traffic Light Violations

More than 1000 persons were arrested on this charge. The report shows a decrease in the number, while 143 persons were arrested on a charge of driving without an operator's license.

Arrests on Drunk Charges

116 compared with 42 the year before. There were 30 charges of drunken driving preferred in 1926, with 26 in 1925.

Crimes Against Animals

One person was arrested for cruelty to animals, and one on each of the following charges: indecent exposure, driving on closed road, insanity, carrying concealed weapons.

More Liquor Seized

More than twice as much liquor was seized and destroyed last year as the year previous, the figures being 98 gallons for 1926 and 33 for 1925.

Automobile Accidents

Numbered 76 last year and only 23 in 1925. There were 67 collisions committed during the year, with 23 the total for the year previous.

Number of Dogs Killed

65 being the total for 1926 and 83 for 1925. Three bad checks were reported as compared with 15 in 1925, and 49 persons were lodged in the village jail last year, against 31 in 1925.
