

# FORMER RESIDENT DIES IN DETROIT

### Mrs. Mary Porter, 78, Succumbs To Apoplexy; Husband Was Supervisor

Funeral services were to be held at 2 p. m. today for Mrs. Mary Porter, the widow of Andrew Porter, who served for 10 years as supervisor of Bloomfield township, 20 years ago.

Mrs. Porter died Monday of apoplexy at the home of her daughter, Mrs. E. L. Andrea, 4734 Pacific avenue, Detroit, where she has been living since the death of her husband here 16 years ago.

Besides Mrs. Albro, Mrs. Porter leaves another daughter, Mrs. J. A. Bryden, of Omak, Wash. Burial will be in Oak Hill cemetery, Pontiac, following the services from her daughter's residence.

Mrs. Porter, who was 78 years old, was born in the east. A large part of her life, however, was spent in Bloomfield township where she and Mr. Porter occupied a large farm at Square Lake, and Franklin roads.

## ACCIDENT DUTIES ARE POINTED OUT

An operator of a motor vehicle or motorcycle, who knows that damage has been caused to a vehicle due to his culpability, or due to an accident involving his machine, must stop and give his name, residence, street, number and license number to the person suffering the damage, or to a policeman, in case no policeman is in the vicinity, then it is his duty to go to the nearest police station or judicial officer. If injury is caused to a person, the information above specified must be given to both to the person injured and also to the police.

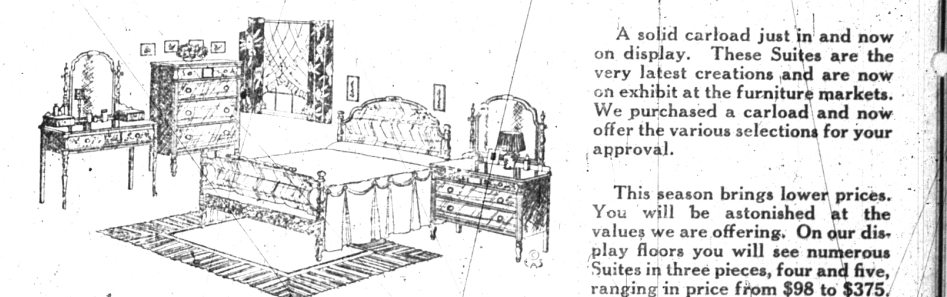

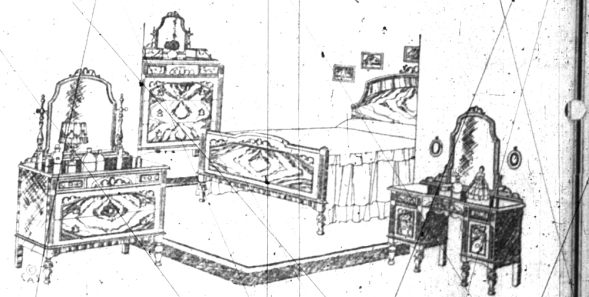
