Annual Report Shows Increased Activities For Year 1926 Birmingham's fire department has a personnel of 24 men at New Avenue, according to the annual report which is in the hands of Manager Harry S. Starr today. One new man, Jack Moody, 406 Pierce street, was added to the force during the year.

Property endangered during the year was \$100,000 less than in 1925, the report shows. In 1925, property valued at \$380,000 was damaged, while in 1926 only \$260,000 was menaced. The actual loss of property by fire during 1926 amounted to only \$8,000. During 1925, \$4,145 worth of property was lost.
