

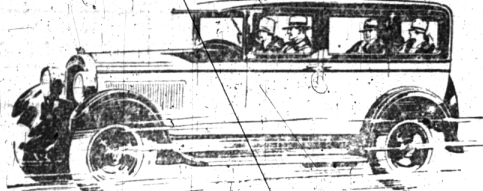
News From Baldwin High School.

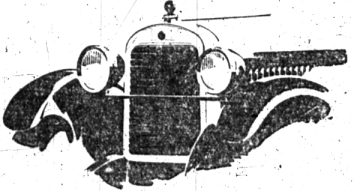

Mrs. G. Garner of San Francisco was granted a divorce after telling the judge that her husband cursed and struck her when she trumped his age in a bridge game.

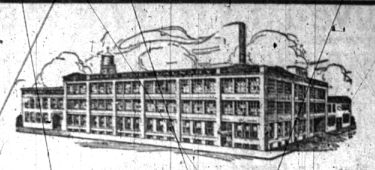
GIRL SCHOOL LEAGUE ATTRACT MANY HERE

Cubs 14—Celtics 6. The second half, as in the previous game, was much faster than (Concluded on Page 7, Part 2)



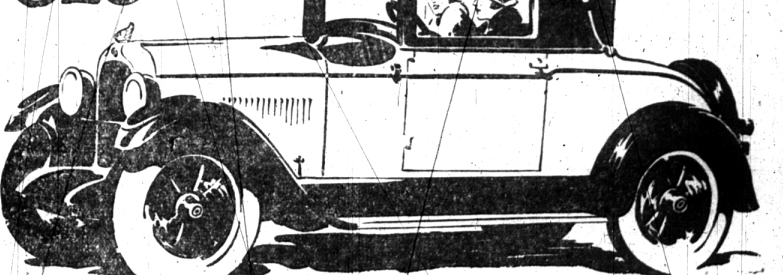
