NEW HOSPITAL CARES FOR 250

St. Joseph Authorities See Need For Nurses Training Quarters

Two hundred and fifty seven patients already have been cared for in the new St. Joseph's Mercy hospital in Pontiac after two months of activity. In that length of time 36 babies have been born in the maternity department of the institution.

Of the 165 beds available an average of 45 a night are filled and eight emergency ambulance calls a week are taken care of, although the hospital itself has no ambulance.

Dr. George Raynald of Birmingham has been named vice-president of the hospital, while Doctor Herbert F. Moore and A. W. Newitt of Birmingham are named to serve on committees.

Other officers of the hospital are Dr. L. A. Farnham, president; Dr. Frank Mercer and Dr. Howard H. Barker, board of directors; Dr. Bert T. Larson, Dr. E. E. Kiehl, Dr. Perry V. Wagedy, record committee; Dr. F. A. Baker, Dr. C. U. Bowditch, Dr. C. T. Ekelund, Y. Ferguson, Dr. S. E. Galbraith, rules committee.

Plan More Nurses The state has authorized the formation of a nurses training school and this is already in operation.

At present, due to lack of housing facilities, there are only six student nurses. By September it

is hoped that some more satisfactory means of taking care of patients will have been found and at that time it is planned to have 60 or 65 nurses. Even under the present difficulties connected with nurse's rooms there are 15 institutional nurses on duty daily and an average of 15 special nurse's attend patients in the hospital.

Dr. C. G. Darling is on duty at the hospital as interne and there are 33 doctors in Birmingham and Pontiac on call. The hospital is in charge of 12 Sisters of Mercy a nursing order. The Right Rev. Michael Grupp of the St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary at Orchard Lake is doing the work of the hospital chaplain while Rev. Michael J. Barke, diocesan director of Catholic hospitals, has general supervision of the institution.

All Registered Nurses Sister Mary Ursuline, mother superior, has had nursing experience in Iowa and Michigan and all other nurses are registered nurses except one in the office who is an accountant. A registered dietitian is to be added to the staff in September.

At present serious need is being felt for a nurse's home located adjacent to or near the hospital. It is contemplated that when such a building is constructed it will contain not only sleeping quarters for the nurses, but also exam rooms and lecture halls. Such a building would cost approximately \$200,000 it is estimated.

COUNTY IS HIGH IN SHEEP RAISING

Extension Worker From State College Ranks Oakland Lead

Oakland County today stands seventeenth among Michigan counties in sheep raising, according to a report recently made by V. A. Freeman, extension worker of the Department of Animal Husbandry of the Michigan State College. The total sheep registered on Jan. 1 was 25,190. Mr. Freeman visited Oakland County last week and gave instructions to several boy's clubs.

Michigan likewise ranks high among states, being second to only Ohio among the states east of the Mississippi and having had a total of 1,314,000 sheep registered on January 1. This number is an increase of 141,000 during 1926.

He expressed himself as pleased with the situation in the county, stating that interest among the boys who compose the membership of the clubs, is high, and that their efforts will go a long way toward further development of the sheep industry in Oakland County.

Mr. Freeman pointed out the opportunity for more clubs, not only with sheep but with pigs as well. He also favors additional canning, clothing and other types of clubs, all of which are being aided by the Michigan State College.

Farmers who raise livestock will find a use for what is now waste land, he stated, as considerable land which is unfit for crops can be used for grazing purposes.

Stock raising and farming still can play a big part in the life of the country, he said, in spite of what appears to be a popular belief that agriculture has no place in the county's future program because of the development of manufacturing. The county's progress as a sheep raising area was given as an example of what the future holds for the farmer.

Mrs. Freeman was aided in her work with the two clubs by H. H. Hilden, a Michigan State College student, who is aiding the county clubs in their work this summer.
