more seriously than his brothers in America," said Mr. Shain. "This is probably because of the narrow confines of each country, resulting in limited fields of understandable activity for their peoples. Under such conditions people are eager to accept the ideals that are wrapped up in the things we know as Rotary."

**King Albert Speaks**  
"One of the high lights during the two days of the convention was the appearance and speech of King Albert, of Belgium, who is the only King in the world to fill a classification in a Rotary club. King Albert spoke briefly, thanking Rotary International for choosing Ostend as its convention city, and heralding it as one of society's foremost institutions for the attainment of peace among nations. The King spoke in very good English.

**Germany To Enter**  
"As you all know Germany has never been taken into the Rotary family. Very soon, however, Rotary clubs will be formed in that country. European statesmen are practically unanimous in their declarations, however, that the acceptance of Germany into Rotary International is one of the most important social and political advances since the World War. Europe is pinning much of its hope for the ending of war on the work of Rotary International.

**Rev. Elliott Hiett**, one of England's foremost clergymen, painted a homely, yet very true picture of international conditions and their remedies. He said that England can take a lesson from the United States in all things through the value of treaties that will call for the settlement of international problems through arbitration rather than war.

Mr. Snyder was a varsity football player at Cornell, where his father, Professor Virgil Snyder, is head of the mathematics department. Mr. Snyder received his M. A. in Education from Cornell this year. He taught history at St. Mark's School in Southboro, Mass., one of the best known church schools in the east, until the outbreak of the war, when he went abroad to France. He returned to St. Mark's and from there went to the Valley Ranch School in Wyoming, where he was head master for two years resigning last Spring.

Mr. Keppel comes from St. Paul's School, Garden City, where he was an member of the varsity department. He is a graduate of Colby, class of '12, who he was an all-around varsity athlete playing football, basketball, baseball and track. Mr. Keppel will teach in the mathematics department, as well, having had some experience teaching mathematics. He completed his work for the Ph. D. degree in Education at the New York University.
