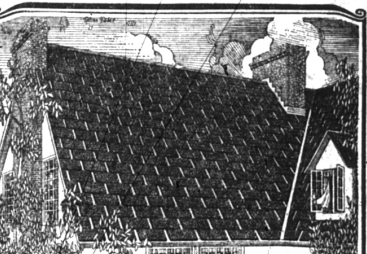
June 21, by Floyd S. Buck, justice of peace, before whom they appeared Saturday.

**RARE FLOWERS GO TO MAKE
THOM'S GARDEN BEAUTY SPOT**

More than 25 varieties of flowers are to be found in what is considered one of the most beautiful gardens in Birmingham. This garden, which was constructed last spring by C. W. Haven, landscape architect, belongs to E. R. Thom of 116 Parrian road.
The garden is said to be an example of what can be done in a small space, and occupies a space approximately 50 by 60 feet. The garden contains an ornamental pool and fountain and is decorated with evergreen shrubs.
Some of the more common varieties of flowers which are planted in the garden are: roses, hollyhocks, hollyhocks, lilies, sweet Williams, snap dragons, columbines, geranium, forget-me-nots, larkspur, daisies, St. Basil daisies, poppies, petunias, peonies and different species of rock-flowers. Besides these there are many rare varieties. A feature of the garden is the unique plant jars which have numerous niches or pockets on the side where plants grow in addition to larger flowers at the mouth of the receptacle.

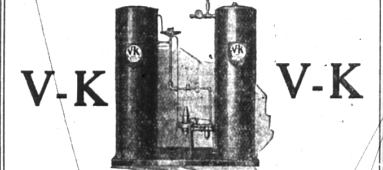

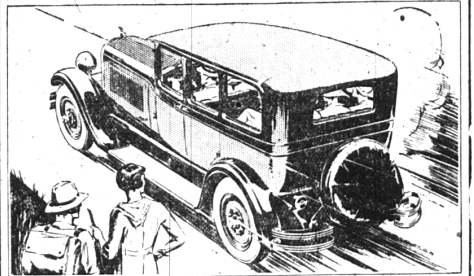
