Four are planning to enter the University of Michigan. They are Carpenter Hewitt, Frederick White, Henry Fredin Schorer, and Elizabeth Hascall.

Credits for two students are being awarded to William and Mary College at Richmond, Virginia. Those going there are Ralph Thompson and Rudolph Zabel.

Ivan Haack plans to attend the Wesleyan college that he attended in the past while Helen Rainer will go to the Genesee County Normal college.

MORE THAN 3,000 NEW 'PHONE BOOKS ARE BEING DISTRIBUTED

Three thousand five hundred new telephone directories are being distributed this week throughout the Birmingham district. The village itself received its quota last week of 1400 copies.

The directories this year, as they have since October 1921, include subscribers in all Oakland county. Three hundred more are scheduled to be issued this year in the Birmingham district than were sent out last year. The total number of subscribers listed in the present issue is 16,733; 2,573 of those are service in the Birmingham exchange. Last year the total number of listings was 15,274, of which 2,429 were in the Birmingham territory.

The first telephone was installed in Birmingham in 1883. On January 1, 1902, there were 31 telephones in the village. Four years later when 100 copies of the directory were issued in the village and 61 names were listed. Five years later 300 copies were delivered and there were 358 listings. By 1915 the Birmingham division had 519 subscribers and 3001 books were sent out. In 1921 the first Oakland county directory was published and distributed. In that year Birmingham had 1030 names in its section and 1200 directories were distributed. In May of 1922 the number of directories issued was almost doubled and there were 1674 subscribers.

Those subscribers whose books are not received in a short time, Mr. Tatham, Birmingham manager, announced, may get them at the office by calling. Directions for reporting trouble, with the service are printed on the front of the new book.

ENTERS HOME, MAN IS JAILED

Sam Scott, who told authorities he lived in Chicago, begins a sentence of two and one-half years in Jackson prison today following sentence by Judge F. L. Covert in Circuit Court, Pontiac, on a charge of breaking and entering the residence of Clarence Denton in Troy Township.

He was arrested by Oakland County deputies on the night of July 18 when discovered in a haymow near his home he pleaded guilty to entering with intent to take indecent liberties with two young girls. The girls were awakened by the man in their room and screamed. He fled and was later captured in the haymow.

Two Are Arrested On Drunk Charge

Trials of two men who pleaded not guilty to a charge of driving while drunk will be held tomorrow at 2 p. m. Both Arthur A. Cunningham, 146 Colburn avenue, Detroit, and Charles Baker, 525 La Prairie avenue, Ferndale, were arraigned before Justice Floyd S. Buck, Monday, but pleaded not guilty.

BERKLEY VILLAGE TO ISSUE BONDS

\$75,000 To Be Spent In Construction of Wells and Equipment For Water Supply

A \$75,000 bond issue for pumping equipment and wells, was carried by a light vote in the village of Berkley last Thursday. The bond issue for a local water supply arose as the result of alleged poor service from Royal Oak, which is now furnishing the village water. The vote which passed the well bond was decisive being yes 214, no 68.

An attempt to appoint a village manager was lost by a vote of 209 to 214. The remaining issue was for the power to make charter amendments. It carried with the vote of yes 150, no 129.
