**POLICE HAVE BUSY MONTH**

Officers Make 167 Arrests During June, Report Shows; Traffic Heavy

One hundred and sixty seven arrests were made by the village of Birmingham police department during the month of June, according to the report of chief of police James Anderson on file today in the village offices.

Of the 167 arrests, 104 were for traffic violations and 63 were in the miscellaneous class. Four persons were charged with driving while intoxicated and 10 were held for speeding. Twenty three persons were arrested for violation of the traffic light and 17 for violating the left hand turn ordinance. Only one person was arrested for driving without lights while nine were held on charges of reckless driving. Thirteen persons parked overtime and six drivers were unable to produce operator's licenses.

Five industries were reported to the police during the month and 14 accidents. Two children were reported lost and 18 ladders were accepted in the village police station. Fifteen dogs were killed during the month and three cats. Five stores were found open and one automobile was recovered. Four arrests were made for drunks.

**INJURED GIRL IS RETURNED HOME**

Helena Pierce, Street Car Victim, Recovering Today From Fracture Of Skull

Miss Helena Pierce, 15 years old, 239 west Chapin street, is home today from the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac where she was taken June 24 suffering from a fractured skull.

The girl was struck by a south bound interurban car at Woodward and Adams avenues when witnesses say, she became confused in the traffic and stepped directly in front of the oncoming car which had just left a switch and was traveling at a slow rate.

Dr. George Raynald attended the girl in the Birmingham police station and then ordered her removal to the Pontiac hospital.

**ALLEGED WHISKEY FOUND IN AUTO**

Driver To Be Examined In Court Today On Transporting Charge; Haul Nets 70 Gallons.

Demetry Machlay of Detroit will be examined today by Judge Floyd S. Buck on a charge of illegally transporting liquor. He was arrested July 2 by Cecil Beneway, Berkeley Village officer, after a search of the car he was driving revealed 70 gallons of what police say is moonshine whiskey.

Arrested Tuesday he stood mute and was committed for examination at 2:30 p. m. today.

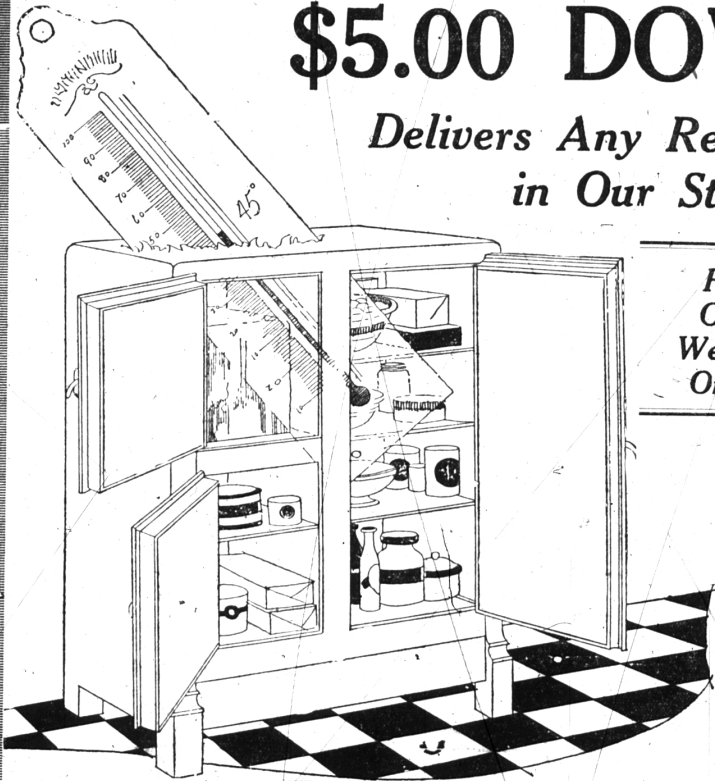
