WARNS AGAINST
A FOWL EPIDEMIC

A warning against a disease
prevalent in chickens in Oakland
County is issued by H. H. Hays,
M. Vaughan, agricultural agent.
In explaining the disease and its
prevention, he says:
"A large number of chickens in
this county are now being killed
by a disease known as cholera.
It is especially common in young
stock and becomes more prevalent
during hot weather.
The germ comes from ground
which has been contaminated.
By keeping the disease
from sanitary and raising the
chick on a clean ground, the disease
is quickly fatal. The disease
often dies in a single night.
When a chicken is contracting
the disease, he becomes droopy
and such a chicken should be
killed and the flock immediately
as the disease is contagious."
