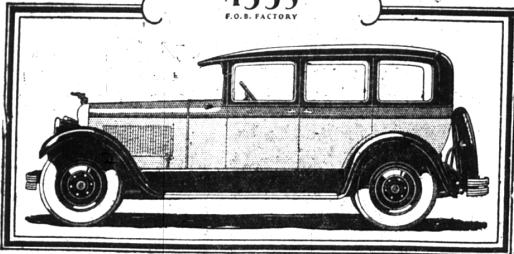

## VACATION HINTS GIVEN MOTORISTS

Olds' Promotion Manager Tells What To Do To Make Hot Days Cooler For Car

Suggestions for Oldsmobile car owners, that will enhance the pleasures of their vacation motor trips have been prepared by T. H. Stambaugh, active promotion manager, Olds Motor Works. They are:

"A complete inspection of the car should be made in advance of the trip. All reciprocating parts should be thoroughly lubricated, particularly at those places provided by the car maker. Inspection and tightening, if necessary, of body bolts, motor bolts, spring shackles, etc., should be inspected and changed, if necessary. The cooling system should be gone over, to be sure that connecting hoses and clamps are in good condition to prevent leaks. Generator should be adjusted for proper charging rate, battery for proper specific gravity and filling lights should be focused, and tires inflated in keeping with the recommendations of the manufacturer. (Under inflated tires can cause an end of automobile and expense.) Front wheels should be checked for proper toe-in, to guard against unnecessary wear. Motor should be tuned up.

"Have distributor points checked for proper contact. The braking system should be examined to be sure that the system is effective and, if necessary, should be retimed before starting out on the trip. The fan belt occasionally becomes loose and its condition should be noted to avoid necessity of this replacement while touring.

"Tire changing tools, with the other pieces of equipment which are usually a part of the car, should be complete. If the trip is an extensive one, it is a wise provision to include an extra tire. Skid chains are a most helpful factor, if the trip calls for travel over icy roads, muddy sections of the country.

"If the route of the vacation takes him through the desert or into the mountains, it is well to provide containers filled with water and oil."

## SUMMER MANSION HAS REFRIGERATION

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 5.—Electrical refrigeration, outstanding industrial development of the present administration, has become an inseparable part of kitchen arrangements for the chief Executive.

The vacation White House in the Black Hills, the temporary White House on Dupont Circle and the executive mansion are all equipped with this type of refrigeration. In addition a special installation was recently made on the yacht Mayflower for the exclusive use of the president and his guests.

A large electrically cooled cold storage box was placed in the executive mansion twenty-two years ago. Household electric ice-boxes and electric water coolers were installed in the temporary White House when it was prepared for official residence. In both places it functioned so satisfactorily that shortly before the recent presidential removal of the fleet it was placed aboard the Mayflower.

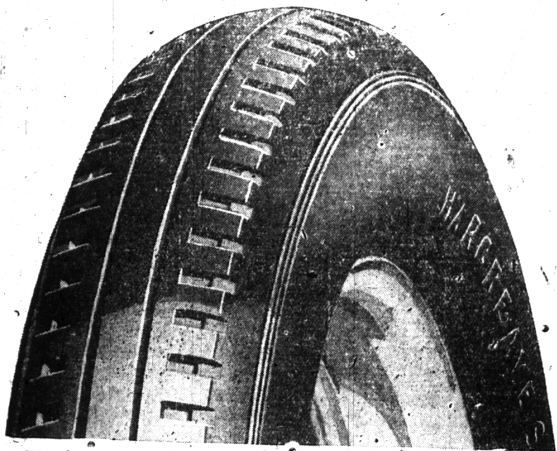

## PHONE COMPANY'S TAX BILL IS HIGH

LANSING, Mich., June 30.—It requires practically the entire earnings of one in every 100 telephones served by the Michigan Bell Telephone company to pay that company's annual tax bill, according to Walter Mizner, the company's treasurer, who today turned over to the state auditor general, Oramel B. Fuller, a check for \$2,037,383.95. For each telephone it operates, the company pays taxes amounting to \$5.26 a year, of which the state share is \$3.88, the remainder being paid on federal and miscellaneous taxes. The company had an average of 225,570 telephones in service last year.

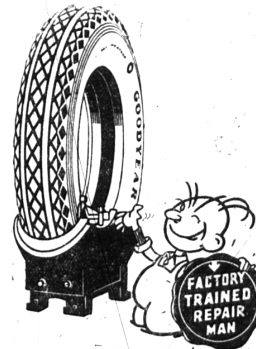
