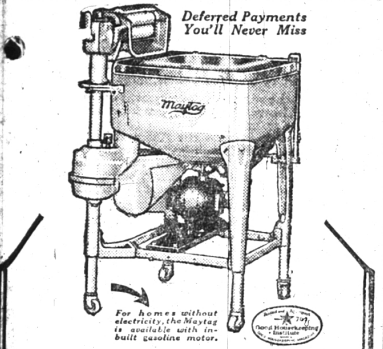

Village Taxes Due July 1st, 1927

NOTICE is hereby given that Village Taxes for the fiscal year 1927 are due and payable, at the office of the Village Treasurer July 1, 1927.

All taxes unpaid after October 31, 1927, will bear the four per cent penalty plus three-quarters of one per cent for each additional month or fraction thereof.

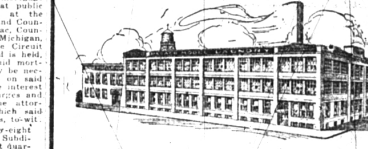

D. 1927, at 12 o'clock M. Central Standard Time, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said District the proposition to authorize the District Board—
