**GREAT PASTIME CALLED DANCING**  
The modern girl starts dancing at the hour her grandmother was leaving for home. The word "ball" has disappeared from society's vocabulary. Gloves and swallowtail coats have vanished from the dance rooms.

Once dancing was only a social accomplishment. That was twenty years ago. The world has changed a good deal since then. Now, says Mrs. Richardson, dancing has become "the great national recreation."

There is no longer any excuse for people not knowing how to dance, she declares. If there are any old fogies left who don't know how, they need not bother to hunt up a private teacher, for they can get adequate instruction, she assures them, from the radio or from phonograph records. Let them just roll up the rug, turn on a new dance record and start in at once.

The rules of the game have changed enormously in the last decade. When dancing was merely a social accomplishment, it was surrounded by "conventions and tricky etiquette."
