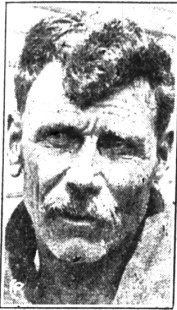

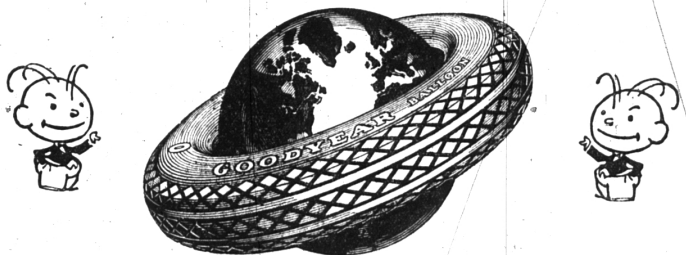
TWO MEN FINED HERE ON DRUNKEN CHARGE

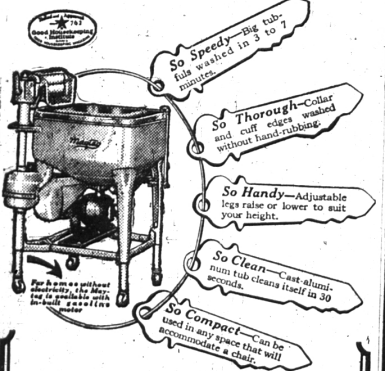
